From Pastor’s Desk

The scripture for today is Genesis 17:19

And God said, Sarah your wife shall bear you a son indeed; and you shall call his name Isaac: and I will establish my covenant with him for an everlasting covenant, and with his descendants after him,.

The promises of God are usually beyond what can be accomplished by natural means. He gives us His Word and requires us to have faith in what He promises to do. Our faith is the sign of acceptance, not only of God’s promises but of God Himself. Faith in His Word equates to faith in God. When God gave the promise to Abraham and Sarah that they would have a son, not only were they old and beyond child-bearing years, but they had never had children, even in their youth. Their solution to the dilemma was to give God a helping hand. They decided to produce a son their way without trusting God’s promise to give them one His way. It did not work for them and still does not work today. In spite of their lack of understanding and confidence in the promise of God, He was determined to fulfill His Word to them and produce a line of descendants from which would come the Savior of the world. God does not discard us when we demonstrate our ignorance and self-reliance. He did not discard Abraham and Sarah because they made a mistake. He gave them another opportunity to stand on His promises and trust His provision in the face of human impossibilities. His motivation was not just to give them the delight of parenthood but rather to miraculously save the world from the destruction of sin. He, through them, was planning salvation for the entire human race. Often, we only see what is directly in front of us, and our limited vision limits our understanding. God’s purpose for our lives is greater than our limitations. He wants to extend through us the knowledge of the Savior who came through the promise made to Abraham. That Savior is Jesus Christ, and He lives in the hearts of those who, by faith, receive the promises of God. That faith moves within us and becomes the motivation for our activities. God has established an everlasting covenant through Christ, and all who receive Him become heirs of the eternal promises through faith.
